Re: Neighbourhood Plan for Medbourne Parish Council.

I am writing to you as I understand that you own land in the Parish of Medbourne. I want to update you about the Medbourne Neighbourhood Plan and to let you know that we would like to hear your views.

The purpose of the Neighbourhood Plan is for people who live, work or have an interest in the village to have a say in how it will look in the future. Last year the Parish Council established the Medbourne Neighbourhood Plan Advisory Committee (MNPAC) to deliver the plan which will cover the period up to 2031. If formally adopted it will form the basis of Harborough District Council planning decisions for Medbourne, as part of the statutory planning process. The plan will contain policies, including ones detailing what sort of housing is needed and where, which open spaces and heritage assets to protect and what community facilities we need.
